Any deviation, alteration, or condensation of the Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training is considered non-compliant and may result in the revocation of the participant's authorisation to deliver the training.

Once you have attended and passed the training course, you will be able to deliver the **Oliver McGowan Tier 2** one day training course within your organisation.



You will work with co-trainers (who have lived experience of a learning disability or autism) to deliver the training, helping them to share their stories in the training room.

You will be professional and handle challenging conversations with dignity and respect. You will adhere to the training content to maintain consistency across Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent.

All patient facing staff (this includes receptionists) and those directly supporting people with a learning disability and/or autistic people, are required to complete their Tier 2 training. You are responsible for ensuring staff within your organisation are trained; **it is not the responsibility of the ICB.**

The number of training courses you will be required to deliver will depend on the number of staff within your organisation. 30 participants can be trained at once. Once all staff are trained, their certificate lasts for 3 years.
