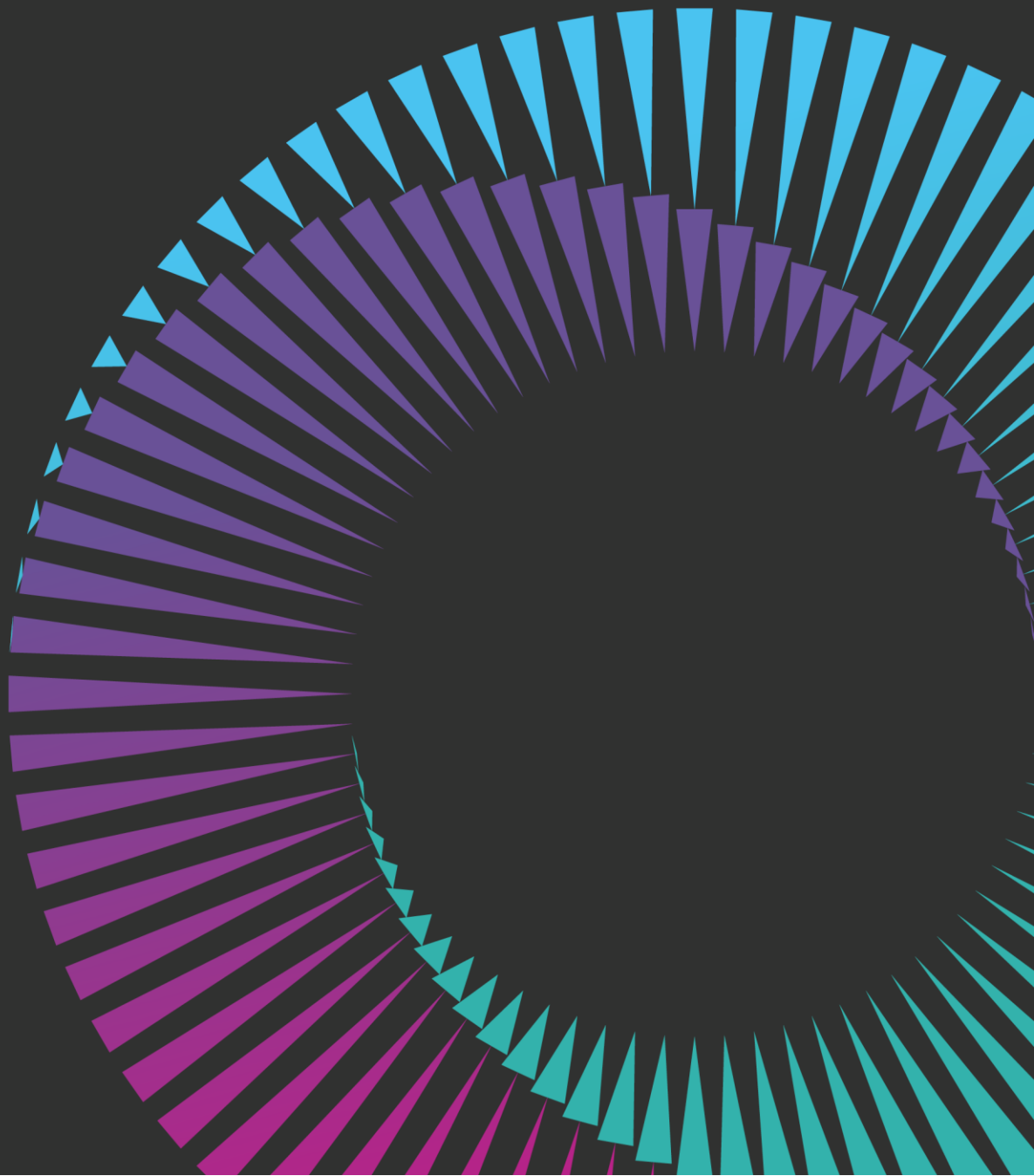


SSOT ICB Cervical cancer

Text message copy



Text messages can be sent out to patients to encourage cervical screening attendance if the GP practice has the capacity to do so.

Female patients 25-64 where calling the GP practice is required to book	You are eligible for cervical screening. The test should take about 5 minutes and is usually done by a female nurse or doctor. Call the GP practice to book your appointment.
Female patients 25-64 where patients can book online via your booking website	You are eligible for cervical screening. The test should take about 5 minutes and is usually done by a female nurse or doctor. Book online: *insert your link*
Female patients 25-64 where patients can book on the NHS app	You are eligible for cervical screening. The test should take about 5 minutes and is usually done by a female nurse or doctor. Book via the NHS app.
Female patients 25-64 who have not been in the past 2 years – calling required to book	If you missed your last cervical screening, you do not need to wait for an invitation letter. Call the GP practice to book your appointment.
Female patients 25-64 who have not been in the past 2 years – booking online	If you missed your last cervical screening, you do not need to wait for an invitation letter. Book online: *insert your link*
Female patients 25-64 where patients can book on the NHS app	You are eligible for cervical screening. The test should take about 5 minutes and is usually done by a female nurse or doctor. Book via the NHS app.
