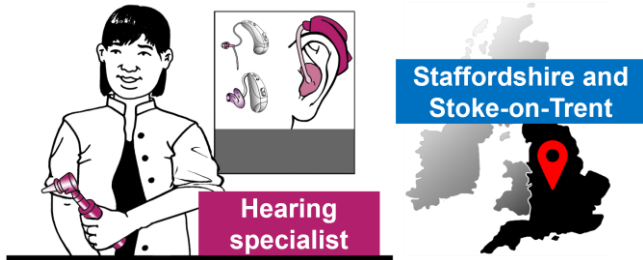


NHS hearing services for adults in Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent

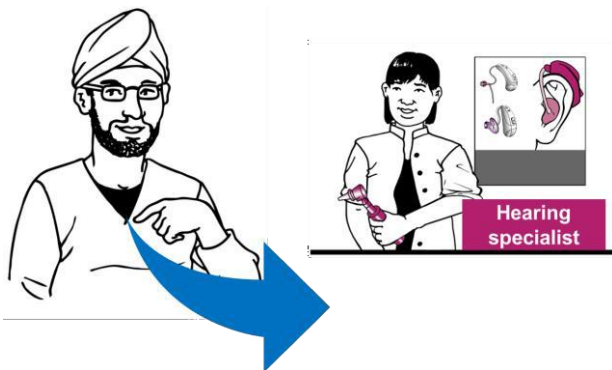

What is this form about?



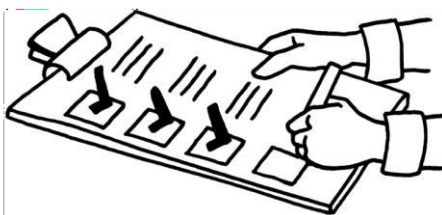
If you live in Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent, are registered with a GP practice in the area and have problems with your hearing, you may be able to refer yourself to NHS **audiology** (hearing) services.



Self-referral means you contact the service directly to make an appointment, instead of your GP doing it for you. This can be a quicker way to get your hearing checked.



Self-referral is **not** the right option for all hearing problems. This form asks some questions to check what is best for you.



What do I do with the form?



If your answers show that self-referral **is** the right option for you, you will need to contact the **hearing service provider** you want to use.

About your hearing problem

If you answer 'yes' to any of the questions below, it means that self-referral is not right for you. You should contact your GP instead.



In the last 3 months, have you had pain in 1 or both of your ears, that lasted more than 7 days?

In the last 3 months, has there been any liquid coming out of 1 or both of your ears? This does not include ear wax.

Have you suddenly (over 1 week) lost your hearing or has your hearing suddenly got worse? This does not include if your hearing was linked to having a cold, cough, runny nose, sore throat or ear infection.

If you answered 'yes' to the last question, you must speak to your GP about this straight away.



In the last 3 months, have you quickly (over 3 months) lost your hearing or has your hearing quickly got worse?

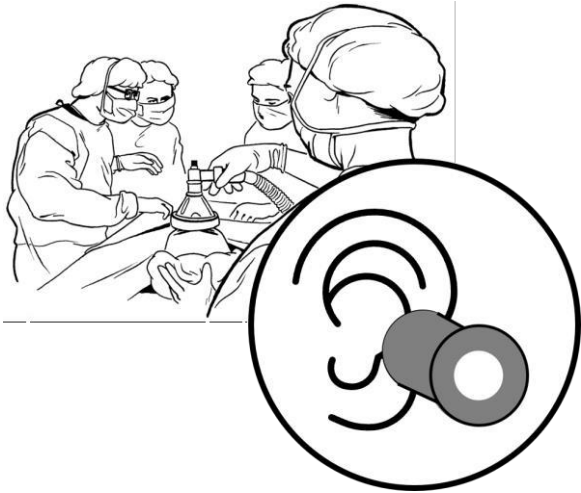

Have you had hearing loss that comes and goes? This does **not** include if your hearing loss was linked to having a cold.

Have you ever had surgery on your ears? This does **not** include surgery to put **grommets** (tiny tubes) inside your ear, unless this was done in the last year.

In the last 3 months, have you felt that you or things around you are spinning?

Have you noticed any 'ringing' or 'humming' sounds in your ears?

This includes sounds that last for more than 5 minutes at a time, **or** are in time with your heartbeat, **or** are bad enough to stop you from sleeping.

If you think you have ear wax

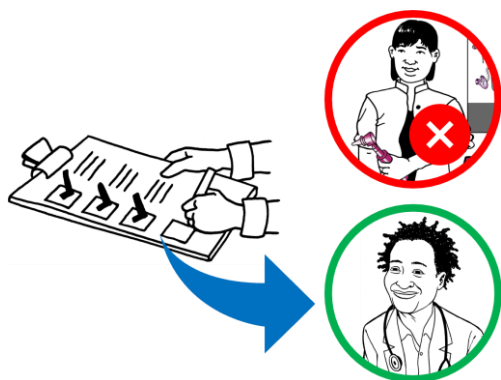


You must tell your hearing service provider. If you have ear wax that needs treatment, they will arrange this for you.



The ear wax must be looked at before your hearing check. Sometimes, hearing aids cannot be fitted until the ear wax is treated.

If you said 'yes' to any of the questions



This means self-referral is **not** the right option for you. Contact your GP for advice.

If a provider helped you to complete the form and you said 'yes' to any of the questions



This means self-referral is **not** the right option for you. Talk to your provider about what to do next.



The provider may contact your GP to talk about your hearing problems.

If you can, you should also contact your GP practice in the next 2 weeks.

If you said 'no' to all the questions

If you have a hearing test and have a hearing aid fitted, the provider will manage your aftercare and hearing reviews.

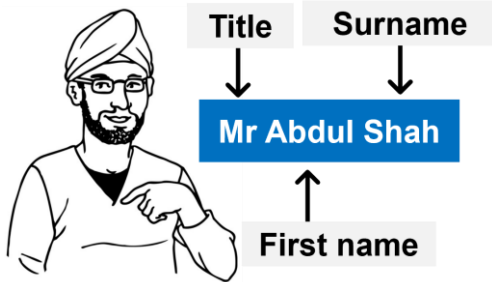


Usually, after 3 years, you can have another full hearing check. You can choose a different provider for this if you want. If you need help with this, ask the provider you were using.

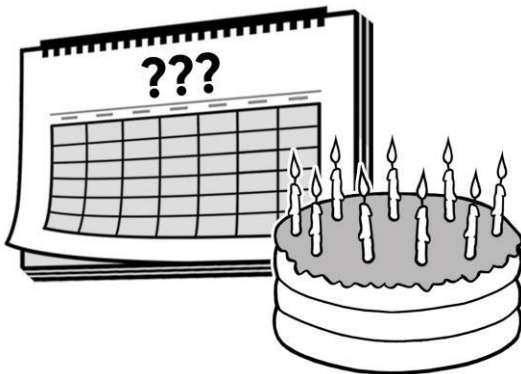

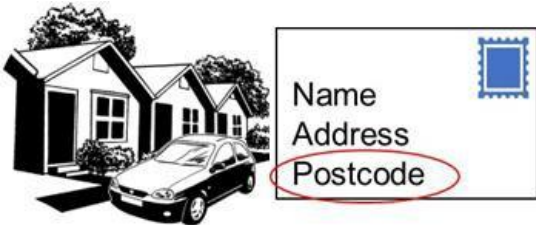
