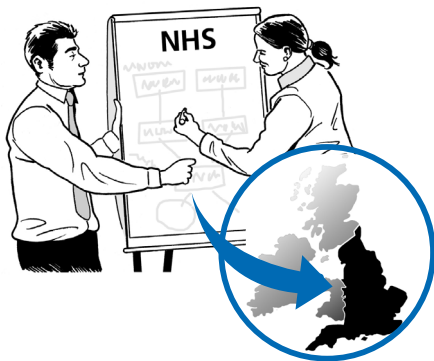


LeDeR – Learning from Lives and Deaths of People with a Learning Disability and Autistic People (LeDeR)



LeDeR is an NHS improvement programme to learn from the lives and deaths of people with a learning disability and autistic people. It works to:

- Make health and care better
- Reduce health inequalities
- Stop people from dying too soon by making care better.



A LeDeR review looks at things that have happened to the person in health and social care. We do the review to see where health and care services can be improved. We look for examples of good things that happened, and share these across the county.

How do I notify a death?



Anyone can use the online form below to report the death of someone who:

- Was aged 18 or over, and
- Had a learning disability or was autistic.
